

ABOUT THE MUSIC

Martin Luther, the German reformer, wrote many hymns to be used in worship services. "Christ lag in Todesbanden" was based on an old Medieval melody and first published in 1524. The text stresses the struggle between life and death based on both the Old and New Testaments. It became the main hymn of German Lutheranism and remains so today. The cantata by J. S. Bach with the same title is based solely on this text by Luther and the main melody. It was written early in Bach's career for Easter Sunday in 1707. Unlike future works of Bach, the melody is unchanged throughout the work. In the first verse, the sopranos have the tune above free counterpoint in the lower three voices. The elaborate "Hallelujahs" at the end of the movement are based on that one melodic fragment at the end of each verse. The third verse is normally sung as a tenor solo with solo violin accompaniment. Despite the somewhat stark melody (I lovingly refer to this as "German joy"), the hymn is musically very powerful in its resolution and Bach's treatment of the tune gives unquestionable finality to Christ's victory over the sting of death. As a musician, I cannot think of another Easter hymn with such strength, the ultimate exclamation mark!


